Speaker: Dan Newman of Hanging Gardens Nursery

Topic: Dendrobiums

Opportunity Table by Dan Newman



Dan started growing orchids in 1982. His first successful subject was a Dendrobium hybrid bought as a tiny seedling at a lei stand in the Honolulu Airport. When that plant finally grew up and bloomed a few years later, he was hooked! By 1996 he had 350 orchids in a one-bedroom apartment. That year he moved his plants into a rented commercial greenhouse in San Francisco. He took over the large species collection of his friend and orchid mentor, Walter Teague, and his hobby evolved into his nursery, Hanging Gardens. Dan started growing orchids full-time in 2000, and moved to a larger greenhouse in Pacifica a few years later. Most of his plants are cool to intermediate growers (really warm growers are challenging in Pacifica, but it's hard to resist trying a few). Species orchids make up his core collection and most of his sale stock. He also grows a variety of "companion plants", which share the natural habitats of orchids. Dan joined the San Francisco Orchid Society in 1987 and served as its president in 1996/97. In recent years, he has spoken on a variety of topics to orchid societies in California and elsewhere.

"Dendrobium is one of the largest and most complex orchid genera of Asia, Australia, and the Pacific, encompassing a great number of horticultural gems among its 1000-plus species. People often ask how to grow Dendrobiums. For such a diverse group of plants, occurring in habitats ranging from the monsoonal foothills of the high Himalayas to the perpetually cool alpine grasslands and steamy lowland swamps of equatorial New Guinea, from the tropical forests of remote Pacific islands to the temperate, seasonal regions of southern Australia, there is no simple answer. The talk will focus on several popular sections of the genus, starting in the Himalayas and Southeast Asia and working southward to New Guinea and the Pacific, with photos of representative species and discussion of their culture in the context of the habitats where they

originate. The goal of the presentation is to share my interest in these fascinating orchids and provide useful information about their cultivation.”

Editor's Notes:

Scott Barrie of Barrita Orchids gave a wonderful presentation on Sarcophilus last month. If you missed getting one from the Opportunity Table and you are not going to Australia soon, you can order these from Fred Clark of Sunset Valley Orchids; he is the largest provider of Barrita Sarcs in the U.S. Also, Chris Mendes of The Tiny Jungle has some available at her Daly City greenhouse: 169 First Avenue, Daly City, CA PH: (415) 623-4079. They are open Saturday from 11am to 3pm (but good to call first).

In case you caught the Sarc bug, Fred Clark was kind enough to let us reprint these growing tips from his site:

Here are the basic requirements for moisture, temperature and light needed for good culture:

- Sarcophilus need to be watered in a way to keep the medium slightly moist. They don't have pseudobulbs to store water so it's the leaves and roots that are responsible for this function. I water them every 2-3 days in summer and once a week in winter. Sarcophilus need a well drained potting medium as watering will be frequent; I have found a mix of medium orchid bark and perlite to be ideal.
- The summer temperatures should range from 75-85 degrees during the day and 60-70 degrees at night with winter temperatures from 60-75 degree days and 45-55 degree nights.
- The plants prefer light levels of 1500 to 2000 foot candles (fc). In hot humid conditions the plants benefit from increased shading, air movement and watering, as this helps keep the foliage cool.
- Sarcophilus generally flower in late: April and early May; I am always reminded that Mother's day is not far off when I see the first blooms.

Auction: (The auction is a great help in funding our speaker program, etc.)

The POS's annual auction will be on Saturday, September 16, 2017; 5 short months away! Start preparing now!

If you grow sympodial orchids like Cattleyas, Dendrobiums, Cymbidiums, Oncidiums, Masdevallias, etc., when new growth arrives in the spring, it is often a perfect time to divide and repot many of these plants. By taking care of this necessary chore, you will end up with one or more divisions for yourself, and at least one that you can auction off. With monopodial orchids like Phalaenopsis, Angraecums, Vandas, etc. mature plants often produce offsets or keikis which can be removed and may be prime candidates for the auction.

When shopping for new orchids throughout the year, think about whether you could divide a potential purchase, keeping a piece for yourself, and selling a division at the auction. Let the POS auction help subsidize your orchid acquisitions!

As you divide and repot your orchids this spring, keep the following tips for our September auction in mind:

Bidders prefer orchids in bloom. If your plant isn't blooming at auction time, **take a picture when it does bloom** and attach it to the auction label so bidders know what they are getting.

Special plants get the highest bids. Rare species or hybrids, awarded or award quality flowers, and well grown blooming sized plants receive the most attention from bidders.

Information maximizes interest. Can your orchid grow outdoors? Does it bloom more than once a year? Do the flowers last a long time? Are the flowers fragrant? Is it unavailable from commercial growers? Does it sell for a fortune on the internet? Etc., etc. Write it all on the auction label.


