Getting to Know Your New Orchid by Chaunie Langland

Show season is orchid buying season. With all of the great vendors available at the shows you are very likely to have new orchids to enjoy. Here are the things I do right away when I bring an orchid home. It takes a lot of text to tell you about it, but once you have done it a few times you will find it takes very little time while giving you a big payback.

Now that you have that new orchid home...

- Research hybrids on the RHS website
- Research species on the Kew website and on orchidspecies.com
- Record it in your spreadsheet
- Research culture information on the internet, in books you own, by talking with POS members
- 1) Research it hybrid.
 - 1) If is is a hybrid (the grex is capitalized on the tag) enter it in the grex name search on the RHS website http://apps.rhs.org.uk/horticulturaldatabase/orchidregister/orchidregister.asp and learn what the parents are. This also allow you to confirm that the name on the tag is spelled correctly.
 - 2) When entering search information into the RHS website you will simplify your search if you do not enter the genus (unless it is one not subject to constant change).
 - 3) If there is no grex name but there are two parents listed then use the parentage search on the RHS website to see if this cross is registered. Oftentimes a nursery will put the parents on the tag without the grex name to indicate that the plant is a seedling rather than a clone or meristem. If you find that this is a registered cross then record the grex name and give your plant a second tag with the grex name on it.
 - 4) Oddly, though any registered cross made with the same two parents has the same grex name, if you put the pollen parent in the cell for the seed parent and vice versa in RHS you will receive the information that no registered name was found. Traditionally the tag should have the seed (or pod) parent first and the pollen parent second, but that is not always the case or the breeder may have reversed them for your plant. Reverse the positions of the two parents if you get a null result on the first try.
 - 5) If no registered name is found, then record the grex name as unregistered hybrid. Check again in the future to see if someone has registered it. If you have this plant awarded by the AOS and the cross is not registered then you will contact the hybridizer if possible and either they will register it or they will give you permission to name it.
- 2) Research it species
 - 1) If it is a species the grex name should not be capitalized.
 - 2) Go to the Kew website http://wcsp.science.kew.org/

- 3) If you are unable to find any information on your plant the label may have spelling errors or a very old name that is no longer in use. Google is often a great help. Type in the name on the tag and it will often bring up the correctly spelled name. Be careful though, some plants have been so consistently misspelled that they have a huge online presence in their correct spelling and their incorrect spelling. Take those spellings back to the RHS website or the Kew website and you will be able to determine which one is correct.

4) Record it

- 1) Genus, grex and, if present, clonal name.
 - 1) If there is a clonal name on the tag then the plant is either a clone, meristem or division. Ethically you must keep this clonal name with the plant.
 - 2) What if it says Cymbidium Mountain Maid 'Carol Z.' x self? Then there is no clonal name associated with your plant. It is a seedling from a plant that was crossed with itself
- 2) Date purchased, seller, price paid and if you like include parentage
- 3) Years from now you will thank yourself for doing this!

5) Research culture information

- 1) There is a lot of cultural information available on the internet to be found just by typing in the plant name.
- 2) For species information Jay Phal's Orchid Species is a great place to check. http://www.orchidspecies.com Be careful though, while you are looking through there you may find more orchids that you just have to have!
- 3) Many nursery websites have excellent cultural information.
- 4) Feel free to call the person or business you bought the plant from. Growers love to share information!
- 5) Remember that there are people at our orchid society who can help you also and are glad to do so.

The more time you put into learning about the orchids you own, the better your growing results will be and over time you will develop an idea of which parents are likely to produce the flowers you love. This will allow you to choose seedlings that are worth the time and effort it takes to grow to blooming size plants.
