This Month's Program: Deflasking Speaker: Tom Perlite

Tom Perlite is the owner of Golden Gate Orchids in San Francisco and has been growing orchids for the past 40 years or so. After receiving a degree in Botany from Cal Berkeley, Tom worked at the Rod McLellan Co., and subsequently started Golden Gate Orchids in 1981. Golden Gate Orchids is a whole-sale nursery specializing in cool growing orchids including Odontoglossum, Masdevallias, Miltonias, and Dendrobiums.

Tom will demonstrate deflasking and planting with two root types of orchids, one with thick roots and one with thin roots. He will also demonstrate mounting onto bark.

This will be a great opportunity to ask Tom questions. He has a vast store of knowledge and is one of the best growers ever.

- 1- <u>Finances</u>: POS financial performance is on-track to meet our budget for 2018, and we see no significant issues that would jeopardize this.
- 2- <u>POS Board Membership for the coming year 2019</u>: As I'm sure you appreciate, POS cannot be a functioning organization without the help of volunteers.
