Speaker: Alan Koch of Gold Country Orchids

Topic: Growing Orchids in the Home

Whether you're growing orchids on a windowsill or under lights, many have had success growing in the home. However, growing indoors offers a different set of challenges than those faced in a greenhouse setting. Alan's presentation will cover the variety of ways plants can be grown indoors, which plants will be the most successful, and techniques to improve the health and vigor of your plants.

Alan Koch owns and operates Gold Country Orchids where he specializes in miniature and compact Cattleya's. Alan started growing orchids in 1969 with 3 Cymbidiums given to him by an aunt. While in college he became interested in other orchids and discovered many would grow outdoors in Southern California. He has moved five times as his orchid obsession has led to the need for more growing space. With the last move, he purchased 10 acres of land in Lincoln, California for his 250,000 orchids. He is recognized as an expert in the Brazilian Cattleya alliance and a trend setter in miniature compact and Cattleya breeding. Alan has been published in the Orchid Digest, the American Orchid Society magazine, as well as many International Publications. He has also been published in several proceedings of the World Orchid Conference. He is an internationally known speaker. He is a past member of the AOS Judging Committee, and the Research Committee, as well as an Accredited Judge and is Training Coordinator for the California Sierra Nevada Judging Center. Alan also served two terms on the Orchid Digest Executive Committee and 3 terms on the Board of Directors, as well as two terms as a Trustee for the AOS.

AOS Corner, April 2019

The **AOS 2019 Spring Members' Meeting** just wrapped up in San Diego, along with the <u>gorgeous</u> San Diego County Orchid Society Spring Show. Following are the highlights of the AOS Town Hall meeting, which provided members with an update on things at AOS, including the various committees who continue to work behind the scenes.

- AOS' fiscal health is good, with total assets currently at \$5,935,000. 2018 showed an increase in revenue from membership and publications.
- Membership is holding steady at 10,000; another membership drive will kick off in 2019.
- AOS Judging: 2302 AOS awards were given in 2018, with 54 FCCs (First Class Certificates, the highest award category), which will be published in the April issue of <u>Orchids</u> magazine, with beautiful color photos of each awarded Orchid.
- SITF: The Species Identification Task Force completed research to confirm 186 first-time awards for new species. (Certificates of Botanical Recognition, or CBRs).
 They report that the ongoing DNA testing by the scientific community, is nearly finished with the large nomenclature changes, though smaller changes will continue.
- This year's Fall Supplement will be on the Oncidinae. to be released in October, with 90 pages of photos, articles, and culture info.
- NEW BOOK! The AOS Guide to Orchids and Their Culture, written by Mary Gerritsen, and with stunning photos by Ron Parsons, is at the publisher now, and will be available very soon.
- The AOS website has been modernized. And AOS continues to enhance their FACEBOOK pages (one is an "official" page, and the other is for group interaction), and the INSTAGRAM site has hit a benchmark 10,000 followers. Check them out!

FUTURE EVENTS:

- The Fall 2019 AOS Members Meeting will be at RF Orchids in Homestead, FL.
- Spring 2020 will be in Sacramento, dates to be announced.
- Spring 2021 will celebrate AOS' Centennial, with a huge celebration at the new Biltmore Hotel in Coral Gables, FL. Mark your calendars for April 8 & 9, 2021. Work is progressing on a centennial book, a historical record of AOS' first 100 years. A new seedling cross will be introduced to commemorate the centennial.

While in San Diego, Susan Anderson, Tom Pickford and I visited Andy's Orchids in Encinitas, and Sunset Valley Orchids (Fred Clarke) in Vista. Both were exceptional experiences, and of course we came home with some hard-to-find Orchids for our collections. What fun... we hope you will take the opportunity to participate in a future AOS meeting and the Orchid growers in the vicinity.

Your support of the American Orchid Society is important and appreciated. Don't forget to renew annually, to keep enjoying your Orchids magazines, and other benefits of AOS membership.


