Topic: Spectacular Orchids: a portrait of the most beautiful and spectacular orchids from around the world.

Peter T. Lin will be presenting a fast paced PowerPoint talk, and will take you on a journey of some of the world's exciting orchid species and hybrids. Some of these are well known and grown in cultivation, others are somewhat rare and little seen in this country. This will be an entertaining yet educational review of the diversity of plants and flowers in the orchid family.

Peter started growing orchids over 25 years ago, but then stopped due to school and starting a career. It wasn't until about 7 years ago that the orchid "bug" came back and he is now heavily involved once again. He is an accredited judge with the American Orchid Society and a hybridizer of mini-catts. He enjoys meeting with other orchid enthusiasts, and can often be found at

Due to limited growing space, Peter likes to specialize in miniature orchids, both species and hybrids, and has received numerous AOS awards. The POS Annual Auction is on Saturday, October 5, 2019

Do not forget! Stick a Post-it Note on your mirror, tie a string around your smart phone, whatever it takes. If someone invites you to another event, turn the tables on them and bring that person to the auction instead.

etc. about the auction! Where else can they get an orchid for a dollar? Plus studies show that social interaction is good for you, so in a sense, auction attendance is the key to a healthy life.

We will need volunteers, particularly to help with plant entry starting at 10:00 a.m. If you cannot come until later, we still need your help. No experience required.

Auction Tips

Aim high! Look at your best orchids and see which ones you could divide and sell at the auction. Quality, not quantity is key. This year, we are going to have fixed priced tables at the back of the auction room for orchids that members are willing to sell for just a few dollars (details to follow). This will allow the auction to focus on rarer, high interest plants.

Get moving. There are **only 71 days left** between our July meeting and the auction. Get busy dividing, repotting and grooming your orchids, and then prepare to cash in when the bidders go wild!

Take pictures. Many orchids do not bloom in sync with the auction. Take pictures of your blooming orchids, print them out, and attach them to your auction plants. Bidders like to see what the flowers will look like.

Check your email. You will soon receive an email from the POS with all the auction details, along with the auction list and plant labels forms attached. If you would like hard copies instead, they will be available at the July and August meetings.

Fill out and submit your list of plants. If you fill out your auction plant list on your computer, email it to Chaunie at the following email address: chaunie.langland@earthlink.net

If possible, send pictures of each plant in flower along with the list, but keep the picture sizes down to no more than 200 KB each. If you will be filling out a pen and paper hard copy of your list, you can give it to Chaunie at our August meeting, or mail it to her the old fashioned way at the following address:

The earlier you submit your lists and pictures, the more bidders you can attract, and more bidding means higher prices!
