2020 SHOW AND SALE INFORMATION

ENTER YOUR PLANTS IN THE SHOW!

Last year, we had a sharp drop off in plant entries - check out the compiled show entry data to the right. The success of the show is built upon having a great showroom filled with beautiful plants in bloom. It is really an accomplishment to have bloomed an orchid, from a Trader Joe's phalaenopsis to an esoteric species, so you should be proud and bring it to the show to show it off! There is a decent chance you'll win an award especially in the novice and intermediate classes! All you need is an orchid with these attributes:

- It is in flower.
- It is free of pests and disease.
- It does not need a name tag! We will help you get it into the right class.


If you have owned the plant for fewer than 6 months, it will be eligible for AOS judging but not for POS ribbon awards. To be eligible for ribbon awards, plants must have been owned by the entrant for at least 6 months.

Make your plants look their best! If you think you might enter a plant, stake it as it is coming into spike, if it needs to be staked. Clean the leaves with water, or 50/50 water and skim milk, or lemon juice. The skim milk and the lemon juice are helpful in removing hard water deposits. Set your plant in a pot that does not draw attention away from the flowers. Dress up the planting media top with moss, hiding the growing pot, if you like. Michaels is an excellent source of inexpensive plain decorative pots and moss as well as green coated wire to support delicate inflorescences. If your plant needs to be hung, you will need to supply a fixture to hang it from. Small hanging plants can be hung from clear or solid color vases. Pendulous orchids will need something to stand on. For further help, call any of your fellow society members.

If you are volunteering at the show of course you do not need to pay the admissions fee and lunch (or dinner on Friday and Sunday) will be provided in the kitchen. Anyone who has volunteered during the show is welcome to attend the end of show dinner immediately following break-down. This is a fun time to chat with other members and vendors. You will be placed on a team, headed by an AOS judge or judge in training, given a list of classes to judge, then head out, find your plants and select the winners. At the end of the judging, everyone gets to vote on the overall winners. Don't miss out on this great opportunity!! Just show up no later than 6:45 on Friday, January 24th.

SHOW RULES & CLASSES

Please review the following carefully, all rules will be strictly enforced in the interest of this show and fairness to its participants.

Any person may enter orchid plants or orchid cut flowers in the show, subject to these rules. Exhibitors need not be POS (Peninsula Orchid Society) members.

Perpetual trophies are awarded only to POS members. Anyone may join POS when they bring entries in if they wish. Plants and flowers for exhibition at the show shall be delivered to the Community Activities Building,1400 Roosevelt Avenue in Redwood City, on Friday, January 24, 2020 between 2:00 and 6:30 PM. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

The show concludes on Sunday at 5:00 PM and plants should be picked up between 5:00 PM and 5:30 PM.

Anyone interested in serving as a clerk for ribbon judging or as a ribbon judge should be present at 7:00 PM on Friday January 24.

AOS Judging

- Specific forms, which are available at the entry table, must completed and left with the AOS clerk or at the show entry desk.
- Since this is a AOS sanctioned show, all plants exhibited are considered for AOS awards unless "No AOS Judging" is in writing on the entry card or display. If you feel that the plant entered has not reached its full potential on this blooming and want to have it judged later, you need the "No AOS" sign on it for it to remain eligible for future judging.
- Plants NOT marked for "no AOS judging" may not be AOS judged later on the same inflorescence. (There are special rules for some Phalaenopsis that bloom sequentially on the same inflorescence.) Judges may not recognize a plant's quality until they begin the individual judging process. Do not count on the judges to spot your awardable entry on their walk through.
- If you feel your plant may be awardable, don't be shy, fill out an entry form. There is no cost for AOS judging, only for awards.

Ribbon Judging Plant Entry

- Entry cards must be completed for all plants entered in competition and for all plants entered for exhibition only. Exhibition entries will not be placed in the judging books.
- Plants entered in ribbon and show trophy judging must have been owned by the exhibitor for at least 6 months.
- For ribbon judging, you need not know the name of the plant as long it is possible to determine which class it should be entered into.
- Plants incorrectly labeled or improperly entered may be disqualified from consideration for awards.
- It is the responsibility of the owner to enter the plant in the correct division.
- If there is any doubt at all about which class your entry belongs in, please discuss it with the clerk at the entry desk. Judges may (but are not required to) move entries to the appropriate class.
- All plants items exhibited must remain on display throughout the show. Removal cannot begin until 5:00 PM. Please talk with Bill Weaver if this will cause a problem for you we will work out a solution.

- Plants may be entered for AOS judging without being entered in the show. You must fill out the appropriate entry form(s) and let the entry clerk know.
- The POS will provide security during the hours the show is open to the public. However, exhibitors assume all risk and liability for their property.

Classification of Exhibitors by Skill Level

- **Novice**: An Exhibitor who has won no more than TEN best of class awards (purple rosettes at POS shows, e.g. Best Novice Cattleya, Best Novice Oncidium) at any AOS sanctioned shows unless a perpetual trophy has not been won also, in which case the exhibitor may remain in Novice if they wish. Only one point is accumulated per plant per show.
- Intermediate: An Exhibitor who has won no more than TEN Intermediate level best of class awards (e.g. Best Intermediate Cattleya, Best Intermediate Oncidium) at any AOS sanctioned shows, unless no perpetual trophy has been won at Novice or Intermediate in which case the exhibitor may remain in Intermediate if they wish.
- Advanced: An Exhibitor who has won more than TEN Intermediate level best of class awards at any AOS sanctioned shows and at least one perpetual trophy. Also, any certified AOS or CSA judge who is not required to show at the Open level.
- **Open**: All Exhibitors required to collect tax from the sale of orchid plants, flowers, or supplies during the previous 12 months. Anyone qualified for any of the other levels may enter in the Open division if they prefer.

Any exhibitor may show at a higher level than required, but once the exhibitor has moved up they may not move back down.

This year each Novice and Intermediate exhibitor will have their name entered for a special drawing at the February 2020 opportunity table, whether they are a POS member or not. POS will purchase an extra five plants for the table. Participants will have a chance to be among the first five people to choose a plant from the table. (One entry per exhibitor.) You must be present at the February meeting or send a representative in order to win.

- Current members of the POS are allowed to sell their plants at this event. The POS will retain 25% of the amount sold and collect tax from customers.
- Numbering system to use will be as an example: for Sue Rose SJR01, SJR02 and so on. Lettering should be at least four characters.
- Print number and plant information on each side of the sales tickets.

MASAKI ASUKA Oct 16, 1954 - Dec 20, 2019

After a valiant 3 year battle against cancer, Asuka died at home with his wife Carla at his side.

"Asuka", was an active and enthusiastic member of several Bay Area orchid societies. He was often at Peninsula Orchid Society selling some of his exceptional orchids in the member sales area and " ompeting" with Chaunie to win the most plants from the opportunity table. He was the only person in our society, or perhaps any local society, who could grow Disas well. His orchids won many AOS awards, ribbons and perpetual trophies. At our 2019 show Asuka won Best in Show, Best Species in Show, Best Pleurothallid in Show and Best Open Entry with his fabulous Pleurothallis truncata. He won Best Odontoglossum in Show with his Odontoglossum pulchellum and Best Other in Show with his Arpophyllum giganteum. His Ponera graminifolia won Best Open Foliage. As if that weren't enough he also won the AOS Display Show Trophy.

In January of 2018 Asuka's Pleurothallis truncata 'Boo Boo' was awarded at CCM by the AOS at our show. In June of 2018, at an AOS judging outreach at our meeting, Asuka's Masdevallia Redshine 'Casuka' (clonal name for his wife Carla) won an FCC and a CCM in the AOS judging.

Asuka had an inspiring passion for orchids, a wonderful sense of humor and a joy for life. He was well known for his award winning orchids and for many years made them available to the public through his Asuka Orchids website and at various orchid shows in northern California.

Asuka was featured in the book A Bay Area Guide to Orchids and their Culture for his expertise in the cultivation of cool growing orchids in the local outdoor environment.

He is survived by his wife of 38 years, Carla Asuka and his brothers who reside in Japan: Shunichi, Masato and Shoshige.

There will be no funeral service or memorial; however, Asuka was an animal lover and supported several Bay Area animal welfare organizations during his life.



Schedule of Classes 2020

Sections are the main Alliances or groups of orchids, and are signified with a letter (A for Cattleya alliance, B for Cymbidium, etc.)

Classes are subdivisions within Sections, and are signified with a number, e.g., Class A1 for Cattleya species)

Levels of skill of Exhibitor: Novice, Intermediate, Advanced and Open. A different colored entry card is used for each category. (Please see show rules to determine your level.)

Plants may be entered in only one class in sections A through I. Plants entered in Sections A through I may also be entered in Sections J or K. A separate entry card must be filled out for each section entered. Plants entered in the incorrect Class may be disqualified from judging or the judges may reenter them correctly at their discretion. Questions should be directed to the clerks at the plant entry table or to the show chairperson.
