FRIDAY, JUNE 25 A BARKERIA ODYSSEY ROBERT MARSH, PHD.

Robert Marsh has over 60 years of experience with growing orchids. He was enticed to start growing orchids in his early teen years by articles in popular magazines and the book "Home Orchid Growing" by Rebecca Northern. With encouragement and advice from Craig Foster of Bluegrass Orchids, which was located near Lexington, Kentucky, and orchid enthusiast Katherine Stewart in his hometown, Winchester, Kentucky, Robert's multigeneric collection quickly grew to fill a greenhouse that he and his grandfather built. For a time, the pursuit of a Ph.D. in molecular biology at Vanderbilt University, followed by several years of post-doctoral research in Germany and at Princeton University, put the orchids on a back burner. But, in the early 1980s, after joining the faculty of the University of Texas at Dallas, Dr. Marsh -- at the naive urging of one of his doctoral students -- returned to the avid pursuit of orchids: first of Oncidium species and then Barkerias, after being introduced to them by Jim Balch of North Little Rock, Arkansas. In 1982 he joined the Greater North Texas Orchid Society. Three years later Dr. Marsh's Oncidium (now Gomesa) forbesii 'Lorenz Marsh' AM/AOS was awarded the AOS Botanical Trophy, called the Nax Trophy at the time. He has written articles and registered a number of Oncidium and Barkeria hybrids, several of which have received AOS quality awards. Following his retirement as Associate Head of the Molecular and Cell Biology Department at UT Dallas, he taught biochemistry as a parttime Senior Lecturer until fall 2020. He continues breeding Barkerias and working to popularize them among orchid hobbyists and establish them as mass-market pot plants. He and Dennis Szeszko, who wrote the recent authoritative work on the orchids of Mexico State, La Orquideoflora Mexiquense, have founded MAS Orchids LLC, which is working with Floricultura in Holland to commercialize Barkerias.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Half the year is already gone, but the good news is that the pandemic situation is so drastically improved from five to six months ago. The San Mateo Garden Center has just told us that they're all set for meetings to occur again in person, and as of next Tuesday occupancy restrictions will be lifted. We can have as many as 115 members in the main room for the regular meeting, and 38 in the Rose room for our skill session. It would be awesome if we test those limits, but we'll be trying to run a Zoom session at the same time, just in case there are some of you who won't be able to make it in person.

We will probably keep the outside doors open, unless it's too cold, or there's too much noise from the baseball field. We will also ask that people wear masks, which will allow us to socialize in much the way we're used to from the past. Wearing masks will reduce our ability to provide liquids and snacks, and we'll have to ask that you consume them outside if there are any available. In less than two months, we'll hold our one-day show at the Garden Center. Since it's all packed into one day, it will be a whirlwind of activity, but having a real live show where we can see (and sell, and buy) plants in person will be great. Admission will be free, with the cost of the facilities being covered by the club's share of the member sales plants. Even more reason to sell and buy plants at the show, as if seeing summer blooming orchids instead of the typical winter/spring bloomers at our regular show isn't enough.

As I've mentioned before, we won't have ribbon judging as we do for the winter show, but rather have a viewer's choice award to the four plants that receive the most votes. There will be AOS judging starting at 10:00 AM, that hopefully will wrap up by noon, so those of us involved with the AOS will have the rest of the day to interact with everyone else at the show. Since a one-day summer show is a first for us, it will be important to learn what works, what doesn't work, and what we could add. If all of you think it was a good idea after the show, we'll likely do something similar in future years, perhaps changing up the month to vary the blooming plants.

The first batch of bark that our Ways and Means director Mark Khoo procured is long gone. The good news he managed to procure another 20 bags of Kiwi bark. As of this writing, some of those bags remain, so contact Mark if you need more bark to finish your annual repotting. They're going fast, but if there are any left, he'll bring some to the Garden Center for our June meeting. Mark has been considering what other supplies would be useful to club members, so if you have ideas, let him know. Right now, pots and hangers are still in very short supply due to shipping problems, so let him know the other items you might need.

As always, this is your club. The board members are here to help things go smoothly, and to ensure the club functions the way you want it to function. If you have ideas or comments, send them to us.
