PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It's almost here! The summer one-day show is only a few weeks away, and I hope all our members are getting excited about being able to go to a real orchid show again. Hopefully, you've all started looking over your plants to find those that will be in perfect blooming condition for the show, or you're doing last clean-up on plants you want to sell at the members sale area.

For those of you who wish to display plants, we'll be able to take in your plants as early as about 8:00 AM, although I won't promise we'll be completely organized by then. We hope to wind down the entry process by 9:30 so there will be some time to do the last-minute organization within the show hall. It will be a relatively simple process as there will be no ribbon judging, just a viewers favorite type of judging. The top vote receivers of the viewers favorites will receive an awesome stemless wine glass commemorating the AOS centennial – reason enough all by itself to bring in those special plants. There will also be AOS judging starting at 10:00 AM, so if you have a blooming plant you deem award worthy, be sure to bring it in.

Admission to the show will be free, and it will be open to the public. The doors will open for entry at 10:00 AM. We're asking that those coming to the show observe a one-way traffic pattern, entering the show through the kitchen door of the San Mateo Garden Center main hall, observing the display plants in the main hall, then going to the member sales area in the courtyard. No one will be allowed to carry plants with them into the main hall, or from the main hall into the sales area. If you wish to go back and see the display plants again in the main hall, please re-enter through the kitchen. There will be no plant hotel, so if you've purchased plants, just place them in your car before reentering. Also, we do ask that everyone wear face covering while inside the main hall.

This is very much an experiment for us, as we haven't done a one-day summer show before. We'll definitely be looking for feedback, both positive and negative, and based on that we'll decide whether we should do this type of one-day show again. An advantage of this format is that we can do this type of event whenever we want, allowing our members to see different types of plants in a show format than we see at our normal show.

Please, it's time to start telling your friends about the show, mentioning it on social media, and generally getting the word out. This is one way we can all help making this a success.

We did hold our first hybrid meeting last month, and it seems those of us who joined on Zoom were relatively pleased with the result. I think there are a few things we'll need to adjust a little for those who attended in person, but we're learning how to do this well. Let us know if there's a problem either virtually or physically, and we'll try to adjust on the spot.

As always, this is your club. The board members are here to help things go smoothly, and to ensure the club functions the way you want it to function. If you have ideas or comments, send them to us.

AUGUST 8 SUMMER SHOW

7:00 - 8:00 AM Set-up show tables, member sales and entry area.

8:00 AM - 9:45 AM Show plant entry - fill out entry card with plant name, your name and the next available number (place number in class box, top left), attach to plant, put plant(s) on a show table. You may also fill out an AOS judging entry form. Plants entered in the show are considered to have been "judged" by the AOS and may not be submitted again on the same inflorescence(s) unless marked "No AOS Judging" on your plant entry card. Chaunie will be in charge of show plant entry. Plants must be picked up between 4:00 and 4:30 pm.

Please remember we need your blooming orchids or orchids with beautiful foliage in the **show room** to make this a successful show. Judging for the show will be done by the public, putting the number of their favorite plant into the ballot box. Top 4 vote getters win a stemless AOS Centennial wine glass!

Please bring your own pen. And if your plant needs help to stand up or needs to be hung for display you need to bring your own supplies.

8:00 AM - 9:45 AM - Sales plants entry - bring a list of all of the plants you are selling, attach a two part plant tag securely on each of your plants, check your plants in with Ken. Put your 5 digit code on each plant. You will receive 75% of your sales price, POS will receive 25% of your sales price, POS will collect and submit the sales tax. Only current (2021 dues have been paid) and life members of POS may sell plants. Donations welcome too! Forms are attached to end of the newsletter. Pick up unsold plants between 4 PM and 4:30 PM.

9:30 AM AOS judging plant entry - fill out a form and give your plant to the AOS clerk if you are not entering your plant in the show. Your plant will probably be available to go home around noon. You need not be a POS member to enter your orchid for AOS judging.

10:00 AM to approx. noon — **AOS judging**. You are more than welcome to observe the judging. Please save questions and comments until after a plant has either been screened or judged. Questions about AOS judging? Please contact Ken or Chaunie.

10:00 AM - plant sales begin - no plant sales prior to 10:00 AM.

Volunteers needed - 7 to 8 AM for set-up. This involves moving tables around.

9:45 AM to 4:10 PM - Volunteers needed to "man" the doors: from the parking lot into the kitchen (no plants coming through there after the show starts); from the show area to the patio (one way only).

10:00 AM - 4:00 PM - Volunteers needed to work at the membership table and in the plant sales area.

Please be aware that POS will not be able to provide food or drink for our volunteers this time. We will have a volunteer relaxation area in a corner of the garden where you are welcome to consume your own provisions. Also, water will be available from the tap in the kitchen.
