Orchid Talk:

Bill Weaver will speak to us on "Pest Control in Orchids." He was a plant geek starting at an early age, dumpster diving at the local nursery looking for cuttings and plants that he could rescue. When he went away to college, he took along his terrariums of carnivorous plants. That was where he "met" his first orchid. It was an un-named white Cymbidium purchased at a drive-in theater flea market. This led to an evergrowing collection of orchids under lights in his little Palo Alto apartment.

Moving to Sunnyvale, once he filled up his back yard, he started renting space in HalfMoon Bay. Over 10 years now, he has expanded to over 8,000 square feet there. After 37 years as a Customer Engineer at Hewlett Packard, Bill has retired and makes his 'orchid money' helping other growers with their greenhouses and repotting. He grows mostly Cymbidiums, Laelias, and other cool growing orchids. Over the years Bill's plants have been awarded HCC, AM and one FCC from the American Orchid Society as well as several CCM and CCE awards for his giant specimen plants. He also has a lovely orange Cymbidium named for him.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This month our opportunity table is from Andy's Orchids. Which means there's going to be a lot of plants that will be new to a lot of us. When you get a plant that is new to you where can you turn to for advice on keeping it alive and blooming it? There are a lot of knowledgeable growers in the society and they are a great source for advice, that is specific to our area. A lot of people turn first to the internet for advice from the wide world. There are a couple of great places to turn to for reliable advice. The first one I always point people to is the Internet Orchid Species Photo Encyclopedia, IOSPE. There one can find photos of most orchid species flowers and some guidelines for native environment, light, temperature and some general cultural notes. Next there is the AOS website, Facebook groups, and googling the name of the plant and culture. Turning all that advice into something you can use, can be tricky. In this case contacting Andy's Orchids themselves and asking for advice might also be a good route to success, their website usually has good suggestions for cultural notes for the plants they sell.

Most of us that don't have greenhouses and very specialized growing areas will need something simple that we can do to provide our plants with the conditions they need. I have shelves with lights, that can basically provide three levels of light: low, medium and high. The shelves are also different heights so that I have someplace to put larger and smaller plants. I can't really do much about temperature, but I generally go with the rule of thumb, that if you are comfortable, your plants are too. I try to keep the humidity up around them, by watering sufficiently and putting plastic up on three sides of the shelves to keep humidity near the plants, and off my walls. That's all for this month, I hope you have many blooms and spikes developing.

Neofinetia falcata Furun, Stelis hirtzii, Epigeneium chapaense, Dendrobium unicum, Sedira japonica Minmaru, Masdevallia melanoxantha, Maxillaria variabilis, Dendrobium rekonense (in bud!), Haraella odorata (in bud!), Eria obesa (in flower!), Scaphyglottis amethystium, Maxillaria arachnites (in bud!), Maxillaria lindleyana, Pleurothallis phalangifera, and Cyrtochilum falcipetalum.
